What does an interpreter do?


- The language of the hearing and/or speech impaired
- Sign language is different in every language.
- Uses body language, manual communication
- Receives a message in one language and relays it as accurately as possible just as any interpreter.



Types of sign languages



- Deaf sign languages
- Auxiliary sign languages
- Signed modes of spoken languages



Where can interpreters work?



- TV stations
- Public institutions
- Education
- Freelancers: occasional jobs,
e.g.: police interrogation, wedding, business meetings, etc.
- Same salary as other interpreters in Hungary
